CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All animals will be catalogued on entry and must pass a night before inspection carried by the Society appointed Inspector and bulls must also reach the target weights set for entry. These inspections will take place on the night before the sale (3 - 6 pm). Animals which fail inspection cannot be offered for sale and must be removed from the sales yard by 8-00 am on the morning of the sale. Inspection of animals for DRAFT Sales will take place on farm before cataloguing.

- Weight Limits for Bulls All bulls must reach the minimum weights as set by the Society. The Minimum weights are printed on the Sale Fact Sheet and are available on www.irishsimmental.com
 - Note Bulls can only be weighed once at inspection.
- 2. All cattle entered for this Show and Sale must be accepted for entry in the Society Herd Book and are in the Pedigree Herd of the vendor three months prior to Sale Date & 6 months in the case of imported animals.
- 3. Sale will be run under the rules and regulations of the Irish Simmental Cattle Society Ltd.
- 4. All bulls must have a nose ring in place.
- 5. Each animal must be supplied with a halter, to become the property of the purchaser immediately after the animal is sold. The Society will deduct €10 from the sale price to provide the purchaser with the halter if this requirement is not met. The use of steel halters is not permitted under any circumstance.
- 6. The Council of the Irish Simmental Cattle Society will set a base-selling price.
- 7. All maiden heifers must be guaranteed free of calf. Any females having been flushed must be declared as such.
- 8. If a vendor elects to guarantee a female offered for sale as being in-calf, the only guarantee acceptable is a positive pregnancy test certified by a Veterinary Surgeon.
- 9. Sellers of all animals sold for export to mainland UK or N. Ireland will be liable for a 2% sale price deduction (if animals are exported on Society organised transport)
- 10. The Society reserves the right to refuse admission of any animal to the sale.
- 11. Sales of all animals present on the day (in sales ring or outside after being through the sales ring) must be put through the marts books. Any breeder found doing otherwise will be excluded from sales for 12 months.
- 12. Entry Numbers If entry numbers are in excess of agreed targets, Council reserves the right to cancel Younger Classes and refund fees.
- 13. All Exhibitors must wear White Show Coats when entering the Show & Sales Ring.
- 14. Blood Sampling Council has taken the decision to continue with the policy of sampling at selected sales for sedatives and other banned substances. If sampling is being carried out at this sale, these samples will be taken by a Veterinary Practitioner on the Friday evening coinciding with inspections at 6pm. A percentage of animals will be selected for testing randomly by a Council Committee on Friday evening and breeders will be notified. Breeders who have any concerns are asked to be with their animals at all times.
